

**Please Note** – The ballot date for entries will be 6th March 2020 and if over subscribed, a wait list will be operated. Please post application forms with your cheques dated 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020, made payable to Area 22 (not Jacqui McAdam), plus include any additional food required and stabling in your entry fee. Cheques will be banked as soon as your application is accepted (not before 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020) and any withdrawals will only be refunded should a replacement from the wait list be found. Any replacement must be arranged by Area 22. You will be contacted prior to cheques being cashed to confirm your place.

### **Important notes for Camp Application 2020**

1. Applications will be accepted from 7<sup>th</sup> February 2020
2. All applications will have equal opportunity to be allocated a space. Where there is an over subscription, a blind ballot will be used to allocate the spaces. Thereafter, a waiting list will be created using a blind ballot and any applications will then be allocated a slot where spaces allow
3. All cheques will be banked upon acceptance but you will be advised prior to this
4. No application will be accepted without full payment
5. No application will be accepted without the current 2020 form completed
6. No application will be accepted without a valid, current membership no from a club that has paid up its subscription fees to Area 22 for 2020. This is very important!
7. Only 1 horse per person, per application allowed. No one other than the named rider/camp attendee may ride the named horse
8. Minimum age of rider 18. Minimum age of horse 4
9. All horses must remain stabled onsite for the duration of camp
10. No horse may be left unattended, there are plenty of people to keep an eye on them if you need to leave site for any reason, please ensure you organise cover prior to leaving site and inform the Stable Manager
11. No horse may be left tied up outside the stable unattended
12. Lessons are made up of groups dependent on level so please ensure that you are accurate with your skill level. Please provide information on current level of activity for you and the horse on the application. This information is essential to ensure you are placed in groups with others at the same level
13. X country is dangerous, please ensure that you are competent and secure prior to selecting these sessions. In the event that your instructor does not deem you secure / competent to ride X country you may be asked to leave the session in which case we will find an alternative session for you to join which may be more suitable. Body protectors and correct skull cups must be worn during XC lessons
- 14. All horses attending camp must have an up to date flu vaccination in accordance with BRC rules. Passport vaccination copies are required along with your camp form**
15. Stables must be fully cleared out, normally 2 metres from the stable door. Your passport will not be returned to you until your stable has been checked
